## Tour de Yorkshire and Polling Day is 2nd May



Thursday 2nd May will see the Tour de Yorkshire come to North Ferriby for the first time. This is excellent news for the village and we are delighted that our Parish Council is making it a real community event. In the village there will be lots going on. Children from North Ferriby CE Primary School will be creating art on the field to be seen by the helicopter. They will also be decorating the area around the crossroads. The theme for the first race day is 'Heritage'. The school and the parish council are focussing on the Bronze Age boats which were discovered on the foreshore. Look out for the half scale replica Bronze Age boat, The Oakleaf, in Coronation Gardens. Local businesses are getting involved in the event so do please pop along to The Duke of Cumberland and to Vive le Velo during the day to enjoy what they are putting on for you.

The route of the tour, Woodgates Lane, High Street and Swanland Hill will be decorated with bunting and the recycled bikes that residents have kindly donated. If you want to get in the spirit it would be great to see homes throughout the village decorated in bunting, flags, bikes or anything else that takes your fancy.

**The race is expected to come through the village at approximately 3.10pm** depending on conditions. So do get in position early and remember that roads will be closed for a while before the race comes through.

Of special interest in the race could be one of the Ribble Pro Cycling team members, Alex Dalton, 22, lives in North Ferriby and is hoping to be picked to race through his own village. **W**hen we were last elected in 2015, we promised we would keep you informed on many issues pertaining to both North Ferriby and the wider South Hunsley Ward. It has been an eventful four years and we're pleased to reflect on some of the issues we've informed you about through our InTouch newsletters:

- The work that was undertaken by the council to improve surface water drainage at Brickyard Cottages last year but nevertheless flooding occurred on two occasions last summer. We supported residents and, along with David Davis MP, we put pressure on Yorkshire Water to do a thorough investigation
- The improvement work to the road surface in Corby Park
- The expansion of the waste recycling facility in Gibson Lane, Melton, which includes an increasing complexity of processes. Working with Welton and North Ferriby parish councils we have kept you informed and also represented you in opposing the proposals
- The plans to build up to 510 homes on Melton Fields. We have represented residents to oppose the plans because of the impact on local facilities.
- Improvements to the junction of Great Gutter Lane with the A164. That scheme is now underway which will make travelling a lot safer for our residents
- Our meetings with Highways England to encourage ways to secure a better flow of traffic on the A63 to and from the city and to improve safety for all our residents
- The closure of South Hunsley School swimming pool which we opposed alongside residents
- The fight to secure better funding for our local schools

We achieved certain success with the planning applications for the waste processing plant in Melton in that the application to move to 24 hour working was rejected. We worked hard with neighbouring local businesses to the plant and our MP, David Davis, to secure this result. All other applications were regrettably approved despite our best efforts.

Going forward it is essential that both ERYC and the Environment Agency are aware of the impact the plant has on our village. We must all invest time to inform both parties of nuisance, whether that be odour, dust, noise, instances of rubble dropping off vehicles or litter escaping from trucks and skips.
